### Trials (Head A. Raabe)

The clinical trial list is completed. We have identified about 50 potentially interesting studies in unruptured aneurysms, subarachnoid hemorrhage, arteriovenous malformation, dural arteriovenous fistulas, cavernous malformations, intracerebral hemorrhage, and extra-intracerebral bypass. Standardized slides (one slide for one study) with the most relevant information and a link to the study on [clinicaltrials.gov](http://clinicaltrials.gov) are created. During the vascular section meeting in Nice we will present an overview of the most interesting trials. The idea is to give an update yearly and to provide the opportunity to discuss these trials and ideas of trials of the EANS vascular section.

#### Liaison with other Disciplines (Head P Vajkoczy)

We have launched the EANS Neurovascular Newsletter with Drs Hecht, Burkhard and Germans. The first two editions are out and have stirred a lot of interest. We will also use the Newsletter as a platform to discuss cases and academic developments.

Furthermore, we have approached the German Neuroradiological Society for finding ways to collaborate in the field of a joint endovascular Training and building interdisciplinary endovascular teams. Unfortunately, this was completely blocked so far.

Finally, continue to have joint symposia with the two European Stroke societies (ESO and ESC) and we are planning a continuation with both of them for 2019. Our collaboration with our strong ally ESMINT is further developing well. This year's ESMINT meeting was in a way historical since we held our Annual section meeting in parallel in the same congress center, giving participants of both societies the chance to interact and exchange. We have continued our correspondence and interaction with the Stroke Council of the European Society of Cardiology. To foster discussions on basic science, clinical and joint political issues and to raise awareness about the relevance of this interaction amongst the Members of the European Neurosurgical Society we have organized a very visible Joint Session at their Annual Meeting in Munich ESC in August.
